- 01. **(4)** Shortest wavelength emitted by H atom i series limit of Lyman series  $\lambda_{\min} = \frac{1}{R} = 912 \, \text{Å} >>$  wavelength of X-rays which lies between 1 Å t 100 Å.
- 02. **(2)** Magnetic flux through the loop is upwards and it is increasing due to increasing current along *AB*. Current induced in the loop should have magnetic flux in the downward direction so as to oppose the increase in flux.

Therefore, current induced in the loop is clockwise.

03. (1) Momentum of bullet = momentum of rifle = p

$$K_{bullet} = \frac{p^2}{2m}, m$$

Where A is the area of cross section and v is the velocity of liquid flow. When water flowing in a broader pipe enters a narrow pipe, the area of cross-section of water decreases therefore the velocity of water increases.

Hence, the correct answer is option (1).
